Comparison of Section 138 & 198. (color coding: like colors represent similar statements, yellow are stand alone statements). Luke is the first to record woes and they are different and at a different occasion in time when Jesus present them. It's the first recorded instance we have of Jesus saying them. You can see Jesus reverses the order He gives the woes (of the ones that are included in both). He also has woes in each that are specifically for that audience. You can imagine how You might be frustrated with a group of people that reside in different places and that conversation might look different in each location you give it, but have the same general thrust. The same is true here. Overall, Jesus' warnings are all around having an air of religious devotion that is devoid of the heart of God. This is a great way to check your own motives and to consider what drives you. Are you driven after a relationship with Jesus, or just trying to "be a good person". When you are after the heart of God, being a good person becomes a product of your effort. You can be a "good person" and not care one bit about the heart of God. A good side stud would be on Micah 6:6-8.

Luke 11:37-54

37 When Jesus had finished speaking, a Pharisee invited him to eat with him; so he went in and reclined at the table. **38** But the Pharisee was surprised when he noticed that Jesus did not first wash before the meal.

39 Then the Lord said to him, "Now then, you Pharisees clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness. 40 You foolish people!
